The Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981 require all employers to make arrangements to ensure their employees receive immediate attention if they are injured or taken ill at work. This includes carrying out a risk assessment, appointing a suitable amount of first aiders and providing appropriate first-aid training. However, having the correct first aid provision in the workplace is not just a legal requirement, it is essential for the safety of all members of staff!
